WELCOME AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

LITANY FOR THE PAST YEAR

First candle is lit

We light this candle remembering the children who were baptized this past year into our congregation. **This light beams so that all young people may be able to grow up receiving affection and protection.**

Silence is kept.

Second candle is lit

We light this second candle remembering all those who have experienced grief and loss in our congregation: the death of a loved one, the ending of a significant relationship, the loss of employment.

This light beams for their continuing comfort and support.

Third candle is lit

We light this third candle remembering all those who have shared in ministry in this place: Ministers, lay preachers, organists and singers, those who offered pastoral care or reminded us of our wider community, those who visited hospitals, nursing homes, cooked meals or offered transport. **This light beams with the compassion of the Christ One in our midst.**

Fourth candle is lit

We light this fourth candle remembering all those who have visited our congregation in recent times and decided to call this place, 'home'.

This light beams in order that we continue to explore and enjoy everything we have received, as a gift.

Fifth candle is lit

We light this fifth candle mindful of those who have called us to risk the way of Jesus: to create inclusive and safe, open, and honest communities for all. **This light beams as a symbol of hope in the midst of both challenge and comfort.**

Sixth candle is lit

We light this sixth candle having each and everyone of us in mind, bearing each other in strengths and weaknesses, anxieties and hopes. This light beams on the pathways we have welcomed and where we didn't want to go. It will continue to shine for each and every one of us on the new pathways we will tread. Amen.

WORSHIP NOTES

THE PARAMENTS FOR THE SEASON OF CHRISTMAS

The paraments for Christmas Eve include several symbols that are descriptive of Christ and his ministry: the lamb represents Christ's work of redemption; the fish, symbolic not only of our call to be disciples, also evokes an ancient understanding of Jesus Christ, a play on the Greek word for fish - *ixthous*, whose letters, in Greek, create an acronym for *Jesus Christ, Son of God, our Savior*; the crown symbolizes Christ as King; the shepherd's crook reminds us that Christ is the Good Shepherd; the dove represents not only the Spirit, but also Christ as Prince of Peace; and the Greek letters Alpha and Omega remind us that Christ is the first and the last, the living one.

CHILDREN'S CHRIST CANDLES

Parents and grandparents, please have your children look for the Christ candle near the activity bags. They can light their own tea candle and place it with the larger one.
