† CALL TO CONFESSION

Confession is a hallmark of the Reformed tradition. We believe that it is important to begin worship by confessing the ways we've fallen short of God's intention for us.

Each confession is concluded by the **Assurance** of **Pardon**. A liturgical reminder that no sin is so powerful as to keep us from the love of God.

During the **Passing of the Peace** you're invited to greet one another by saying "The peace of Christ be with you."

The Prayer of Illumination is a prayer asking God to shed light on the meaning of scripture, essentially requesting the Holy Spirit to open one's mind and heart to understand the deeper truths within the Bible.

† UNISON PRAYER OF CONFESSION

God our Rock, in you there is no unrighteousness, but we have sinned against you and our neighbor. We call upon your name and then go our own way, apart from your purposes. We are quick to see the fault in others, but do not see our own failings. Forgive us, we pray, for any haughtiness or hypocrisy in us. Correct our hearts, we pray, that we may correct our mouths and our actions. Forgive us for putting our trust in shallow things, and give us faith to trust the sure foundation you have established.
